CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

UNDER SECTION 402 OF THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION LAW

The undersigned, a natural person of the age of eighteen years or over, desiring to form a corporation pursuant to the provisions of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York, hereby certifies:

FIRST:

The name of corporation is The Light Millennium, Inc. (the "Corporation").

SECOND: The office of the corporation is in the State of New York is to be located in the County of Queens.

FOURTH: The Corporation is a corporation as defined in subparagraph (a) (5) of section 102 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.

FIFTH: The Corporation is a Type B corporation under section 201 of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law.

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SIXTH: The purposes of the Corporation are as follows:

- To provide an International platform for the free expression of ideas and experiences in order to foster a global connection among all people;
- b. To engender harmony and synergy among the nations of the world, including but not limited to synergy between Turkey and Greece;
- c. To promote social welfare for the people of Turkey, Greece and the Unites States;
- d. To conduct research, compile and publish information concerning art, literature, and ideas, including, but not limited to, ideas about the future;
- e. To provide a medium for the exchange of ideas for the purposes of facilitating transmission, exchange and communication of information:
- f. To promote the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship;
- g. To unite individuals in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding;
- h. To provide a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest, partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted:
- To do all lawful acts and things which may be necessary, useful or proper for the furtherance or accomplishment of the purposes of this Corporation; and
- j. The above purposes shall be construed as both objects and powers, and the enumeration of specific purposes shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this Corporation.

SEVENTH: Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes, as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code") and shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent tax laws.

EIGHTH: In furtherance of its corporate purposes, the Corporation shall have (a) the powers enumerated in Section 202 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law, (b) the powers to solicit grants and contributions, and (c) the power to receive, hold, manage and invest funds. The Corporation shall have the right to exercise such other powers as now are, or hereafter may be, conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes herein set forth as necessary or incidental to the powers so conferred, or conducive to the furtherance thereof.

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NINTH: The Corporation shall at all times qualify and remain qualified as (a) exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Code as an organization described in Section 501(c) of the Code, and (b) a corporation to which contributions, gifts or bequests shall be deductible under Sections 170(a), 2055(a) and 2522(a) of the Code.

Accordingly:

- a. (i) no part of the assets, net earnings, income or profits of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, director, officer or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation in furtherance of one or more of its purposes) and no member, trustee, director, officer or any private corporation shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the organization's assets on dissolution of the organization, (ii) no substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent authorized by Section 501(h) of the Code), and (iii) no part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the participation or intervention in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office;
- b. upon the liquidation, dissolution, termination or winding up of the Corporation, the Corporation's assets remaining after the payment or provision for payment of its liabilities shall be paid or transferred (i) to corporations or other organizations qualified as organizations exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (ii) to the Federal government or any State or local government to be used exclusively for a public purpose, subject to the approval of a Justice of the Supreme Court of New York; and
- c. In any taxable year in which the organization is a private foundation as described in Section 509(a) of the Code, the organization shall distribute its income for said period at such time and manner as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of the Code, and the organization shall not (a) engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code, (b) retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code, (c) make any investments in such a manner as to subject the organization to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, or (d) make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent Federal tax laws.

TENTH: If any Section of the Code referred to in this Certificate of Incorporation is amended or superseded after this date, such reference shall be considered a reference to the corresponding provisions of the United States tax law as so amended or superseded.

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ELEVENTH: The Corporation shall be operated by a board of directors, the number of members of which is to be no less than three.

TWELFTH: The Secretary of State is hereby designated as agent of the Corporation upon whom process against the corporation may be served. The post office address to which the Secretary of State shall mail a copy of any process against the Corporation served upon it is: Ms. Bircan Unver, 87-82 115th Street, Richmond Hill, NY 11418.

THIRTEEN: The Corporation shall have no members and the Board of Directors of the Corporation shall, in the manner, prescribed in the by-laws, manage the affairs of the Corporation.

OF

THE LIGHT MILLENNIUM, INC.

ARTICLE I.

NAME

1. The name of the corporation is The Light Millennium, Inc.

ARTICLE II.

OFFICE AND PLACE OF MEETINGS

- The office of the corporation shall be located in the City of New York,
 State of New York. The Territory in which the operations of the corporation will principally be conducted is the State of New York.
- Meetings of the members may be held at such place, within or outside the
 State of New York, as may be fixed from time to time by the director-members of the
 corporation.

ARTICLE III.

DIRECTORS, MEMBERSHIP AND MEETINGS

1. The membership of the corporation shall consist of not less than three and not more than twenty five persons; the first members of the corporation shall be those persons who are named in the certificate of incorporation as the persons constituting

the board of directors; none of said persons shall continue to be a member of the corporation after ceasing to be a director thereof; the election of a person as director shall likewise be an admission to membership in the corporation; and the annual meeting of the board of director-members, as hereinafter provided for, shall be construed also to be the annual meeting of the members of the corporation for all purposes for which an annual meeting of the members may be required by the statutes of the State of New York. Members entitled to cast a majority of the total number of votes entitled to be cast at a meeting shall constitute a quorum. Except for the election of directors, whenever any corporate action is to be taken, it shall be authorized by a majority of the votes cast by members entitled to vote thereon.

- 2. At the annual meeting the members shall fix the number of directors for the ensuing year; the number of directors of which is to be no less than three. Unless the Certificate of Incorporation provides otherwise, directors shall be elected by a plurality of the votes cast by members entitled to vote. The term of office of directors shall be one year.
- 3. The director-members of the corporation shall meet annually for the election of directors and officers and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the meeting. Meetings may be held at such place within or without the State of New York as may be designated in the notice and shall be held on the first Tuesday of February in each year, if not a legal holiday, and if a legal holiday, then on the next secular day following at 2:00PM.

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- 4. Special meetings of the director-members, for any purpose or purposes may be called by the president or the board of directors or by director-members entitled to cast ten per cent of the votes to be cast at the special meeting.
- 5. Notice of meetings shall be served personally or by mail, postage prepaid, upon each director-member not less than ten nor more than fifty days before the meeting if such notice is given personally or by first class mail, and if any other class of mail is used notice must be given not less than thirty nor more than sixty days before the meeting, and, if mailed, shall be directed to each director-member at his address as it shall appear on the records of the corporation. Notice of a special meeting of members shall also state the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called.
- 6. Any action which may be taken at any annual or special meeting may be taken at a meeting of the director-members without notice and without the lapse of any period of time if notice is waived in writing by every director-member of the corporation, whether before or after the meeting.
- 7. Whenever members are required or permitted to take any action by vote, such action may be taken without a meeting on written consent, setting forth the action so taken, signed by all of the members entitled to vote thereon.

ARTICLE IV.

DIRECTORS

 The board of directors by the vote of at least two-thirds (unless there are twenty-one or more directors, in which case the vote of the majority of the entire form shall be sufficient), of the entire board may authorize the purchase of real property by the corporation or may sell mortgage or lease the real property of the corporation, provided, however, a sale, lease exchange or other disposition of all or substantially all of the assets of the corporation must be authorized in accordance with statute and leave of the supreme court in the Judicial District or of the County Court of the county in which the corporation has its office or principal place of carrying out the purposes for which it was formed, shall also be required.

- 2. Unless a greater proportion is required by the Certificate of Incorporation a majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum. If a quorum is present, the vote of the majority of the directors present at the time of the vote shall be the act of the board of directors.
- 3. The board of directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire board, may designate from among its members an executive committee and other standing committees, each consisting of three or more directors, and each of which, to the extent provided in the resolution, shall have all the authority of the board, except that no such committee shall have authority as to the following matters:
- (1) The submission to members of any action requiring members' approval under this chapter. (2) The filling of vacancies in the board of directors or in any committee. (3) The fixing of compensation of the directors for serving on the board or on any committee. (4) The amendment or repeal of the by-laws or the adoption of new by-laws. (5) The amendment or repeal of any resolution of the board which by its

terms shall not be so amendable or repealable. The board of directors may designate one or more directors as alternate members of any standing committee, who may replace any absent member or members at any meeting of such committee. The board of directors may create such special committees as may be deemed desirable. The members of such committees shall be appointed by the president of the corporation, with the consent of the board. Special committees shall have only the powers specifically delegated to them by the board of directors.

- 5. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the directors or a committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing to the adoption of a resolution authorizing the action so taken shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof.
- 6. Unless otherwise restricted by the certificate of incorporation or these bylaws, members of the board of directors, or any committee designated by the board of
 directors, may participate in a meeting of the board of directors, or any committee by
 means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment, by means of
 which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time.

 Such participation in a meeting shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

ARTICLE V.

OFFICERS

1. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, vice-president, a secretary and a treasurer, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of director-

members and who shall hold office for one year and until their successors are elected and qualify. Any of said officers may be removed from office by action taken at any regular or special meeting of director-members. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person except the office of president and secretary.

- 2. The corporation may have such other officers, agents and employees as shall be determined from time to time at any annual or special meeting of directormembers, which officers, agents and employees shall be appointed by the board.
- 3. The president of the corporation, or in his absence the vice-president, shall preside at all meetings of members and of the board of directors and shall perform the duties usually devolving upon a presiding officer; he shall see that all orders and resolutions of the board of directors are carried into effect.
- 4. The vice-president, in the absence or disability of the president, may perform the duties and exercise the powers of the president and shall perform such other duties as may be imposed upon him by resolution passed at any annual or special meeting of the director-members.
- 5. The secretary shall attend all meetings of director-members, recording all votes and the minutes of all proceedings in a book to be kept for that purpose. He shall cause to be given notice of all meetings of director-members. He shall have custody of the corporate records and shall keep in safe custody the seal of the corporation, and, when authorized by the directors, shall affix it to any instrument requiring a seal.

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6. The treasurer shall have the custody of all funds and securities of the corporation and shall keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the corporation and shall deposit all moneys and other valuable effects in the name and to the credit of the corporation in such depositories as may be designated by the board of directors. He shall disburse the funds of the corporation as may be ordered by the board of directors, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the president and directors whenever they may require it, an account of all his transactions as treasurer. He shall, if required by the director-members of the corporation, give a bond in a sum and with one or more sureties satisfactory to the board, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the duties of his office and for the restoration to the corporation in case of his death, resignation, retirement or removal from office of all books, papers, vouchers, money and other property of whatever kind in his possession or under his control belonging to the corporation.

ARTICLE VI.

VACANCIES

If the office of any director or any officer becomes vacant for any reason, such vacancy shall be filled by the director-members at a special meeting called for the purpose.

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ARTICLE VII.

SEAL

The seal of the corporation shall be circular in form and shall bear the name of the corporation and the words "New York 2001."

ARTICLE VIII.

CHECKS

All checks or demands for money and notes of the corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers as the directors from time to time designate.

ARTICLE IX.

AMENDMENTS

These by-laws or any of them, may be altered, amended or repealed at any annual or special meeting of director-members by affirmative vote of at least a majority of the director-members, provided notice of intention to amend the by-laws shall have been contained in the notice of the meeting.

Activities

The Light Millennium, Inc. (the "Organization") is dedicated to the following activities:

- a) To provide an international platform for the freedom of expression of ideas and experiences in order to foster a global connection among all people;
- b) To engender harmony and synergy among the nations of the world, including but not limited to, synergy between Turkey and Greece;
- c) To promote social welfare for the people of Turkey, Greece and the United States;
- d) To conduct research, compile and publish information concerning art, music, literature, and ideas, including, but not limited to, ideas about the future;
- e) To provide a medium for the exchange of ideas for the purposes of facilitating transmission, exchange and communication of information;
- f) To promote the theory and practice of the principles of good government and good citizenship;
- g) To unite individuals in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding; and
- h) To provide a forum for the full and free discussion of all matters of public interest, partisan politics and sectarian religion alone excepted.

The Organization's Primary Activities are:

- a) Producing, researching, publishing and broadcasting in English, Turkish and any other languages for which translators are available.
- b) On various mediums such as;
 - i. The Internet (www.lightmillennium.org);
 - ii. Cable television and satellite platforms for television projects, including documentaries on art and social issues through available public access facilities.

- iii. Film: Producing feature films on freedom of expression, future or consciousness, such as, FM-2030's 'suspension until the year 2030', an inspiration from Arthur C. Clarke's book or 'from Socrates to Sheik Bedreddin & Nazim Hikmet' in the frame of 'freedom of expression' concept.
- iv. To open an avenue for people to help and encourage them to think about their experiences and life itself rather than their daily life sanctions or their daily life burdens, by encouraging them to focus and express their ideas in written form or visual or a combination of both mediums. This approach applies to the Light Millennium e-magazine, The Light Millennium TV series and Turkish & Greek Synergy, which is an existing platform and avenue for the Light Millennium, Inc., at this moment.
- c) We also plan to set up the Light Millennium's ON-LINE discussion platform monthly, where one or two concepts/quotes or 2 or 3 questions will be selected by the Board of Directors and suggested ideas by the participants. Whoever wishes to be on the organization's on-line platform will be able to freely and openly post their submissions. This approach also applies in a very similar structure to the e-magazine and the Turkish & Greek Synergy platform.
- d) What will the organization accomplish with the on-line platform? The organization will be able to establish and create a newly interactive on-line platform under The Light Millennium, Inc. which will be an ongoing discussion platform/forum in order to keep the interactivity, the connection, to help participants to think on given concepts and again propose, invite and persuade every generation, different cultural and ethnic groups to a diversity platform with their ideas and visions (depending upon the available language, currently are able to e-publish in English and Turkish).
- e) The organization will not limit the expression of ideas, except political campaigning and the promotion of war.
- f) The organization has been inviting and encouraging potential participants who we are able to reach as a first time participants on its global e-platform.
- g) At the end of each month, all submissions will be re-evaluated and edited before publication as a whole or one concept/text, on The Light Millennium's e-platform under the ON-LINE DISCUSSION link (which will be created when we are able to find someone as a Moderator for the discussion platform and when we are financially set) and also depending on the sponsorship, we plan to compile the submissions in the form of a book every year or every other year as a selection from the ON-LINE DISCUSSIONS group.

- h) We also plan to publish yearly or every other year a selection of articles, interviews, poems and/or artworks which were first published on the Light Millennium e-magazine platform supporting the main concept and aim of the organization.
- i) Organizing various cultural activities such as;
 - i. Symposia
 - ii. International Art Exhibitions
 - iii. Art Festivals and Concerts
 - iv. Film & Documentary Festivals
 - v. Fundraising Events

To promote the organization's aim to achieve recognition, we will be planning various events free of charge. These types of events will be announced in a new issue, anniversary issue, or upon accomplishing a new step regarding our mission. Thus, we will also organize a "press conference," "cultural gathering," "poetry reading," "a panel discussion or seminar," "documentary screening," a symposia or tribute events.

On May 2, 2002, an event was held for renowned Turkish poet Nazim Hikmet's 100th Birthday as selected poems of Nazim Hikmet and a short biography of his life were read by participants of the event, sponsored by Federation of Turkish American Associations, Inc. based in New York (free of charge). The Federation provided the logistic support, such as location and general expenses, and The Light Millennium, Inc. was responsible for organizing the content of the event. (UNESCO internationally announced that the year 2002 is a celebration of Nazim Hikmet's 100th Birthday.)

The organization's goals are to encourage people to think about their experiences, focus on writing them to express their ideas related to their own interest area, or to share a common happiness or unhappiness and learn from each others experiences and to understand different cultures, religion and ethnic groups so that we can create better harmony and diverse platforms.

The organization is not aiming to structure itself as a school but rather to freely and completely provide an electronic platform or printed forum to create a global platform to invite everyone who has access to the web, to connect with each other. Therefore, we aim to educate people in different levels than any form of school understanding because we will be teaching each other, we will learn from each other as well as think, write, express and share ideas with each other. We can help each other to come up with a sentence which may give courage or positive strength to others, or a photo or artwork or an article to inspire others to transform their experiences into an intellectual product. As a result, the participants have a platform to identify themselves and to present their ideas,

experiences and to express themselves. We also aim to persuade young generations to bring their imaginations, expectations or skill onto the platform along with adult perspectives.

The Light Millennium, Inc.'s concept and purpose is to activate the ON-LINE discussion platform and seek sponsorship for print-publications from the existing platforms... The given facts are examples of the organizations activities for the "public interest" purpose, however, it is not limited only within the existing ones.

The organization's sole purposes deal with these ongoing projects as well as near and future projects which are purely for the "public interest" in that they help humanity grow intellectually, rather than have people lose their experiences, ideas, memories, and expectations of the world. Thus, we have been creating a common consciousness of our time, and making it available on our web site with each new issue as well as with the 'Archive' link, globally. Furthermore, we will continue to increase and enhance it with each new issue and different languages which will be included as our 'common consciousness' for current research and study, as well as for future generations.

The Light Millennium, Inc. is involved in producing and publishing an e-magazine. The Light Millennium's TV series broadcasts at the Queens Public Television on channel 34 on Mondays and channel 35 on Thursdays, and we introduced the Turkish and Greek Synergy web site in October 2001.

These are the existing platforms and the organization serves its above mission and purpose for the public interest in order to foster global harmony, to build up better ideas for tomorrow and for our children, as well as enhance our visions:

- a) To provide an Internet, TV and in print form, still or moving images, and audio-video platform, where individuals from all walks of life (professional or non professional, young or old), are encouraged to contribute and submit their work and to express their ideas, commentaries, expectations, and to identify themselves.
- b) To invite all interested individuals to produce their ideas and exchange and share their commentaries, to share a common vision to better human conditions and create a better communication system between them.

Selected submissions will be published from time to time (depending on the sponsorship or the contributions for the Light Millennium, Inc.) in the form of a book; in terms of exchanging, compiling all the various ideas, experiences, expectations and dreams, and to be able to leave these publications for the future generations.

Accordingly, The Light Millennium does not and will not ask for money from any of its participants to produce, publish or broadcast their ideas, visions, visual concepts or projects. The Light Millennium also will not charge any subscription or membership or maintenance fee.

Organization provides products and the charges are determined as follows:

E-publications in various languages, producing and cable casting TV programs and documentaries. E-publications on the web in any language are available free of charge to public and also free for all schools or for educational purposes.

LMTV projects, which are shown or will be shown under the LMTV series at the QPTV or any other public access televisions, via satellite or web casting, will be free with a requirement as a non-commercial broadcasting. We will also support and schedule other educational, cultural programs to broadcast which will be produced by the other not-for-profit organizations or producers.

Copyright fee: To reprint, publish, or produce any of the materials from the e-publication or its archives for profit purposes (if a company or person claims it). We will ask \$100 dollars for a full single-page article; which will be split in two parts as 50 percent is donated to the organization and the other 50 percent will go to the participants. For instance, a three-page article will be charged \$300 for any profitable reproduction purposes with the organization's full credit.

For other not-for-profit organizations to reproduce or republish any material, which was originally published on the organization's platform, we will require full credit for the organization as well as seek common ground for joint projects.

For existing television programs or future ones, any member of the public may obtain a VHS copy for a \$20 donation plus shipping & handling, for any 30 minute project from the LMTV series. For a VHS copy of a 58-60 minute documentary or television projects, we will ask for a \$30 donation plus shipping & handling.

Each printed book published by the Light Millennium, Inc. will be publicly available for \$20 to \$30 dollar donations. The books will be publish in every language that is available on the Light Millennium's global platforms with color pictures and around 400-500 pages.

From time to time, we plan to have a special issue which will focus on a special subject or research in printed form of the Light Millennium, particularly when we are able to epublish monthly. Each special issue will be available for a \$7 to \$10 dollar donation to the organization (plus shipping & handling).


