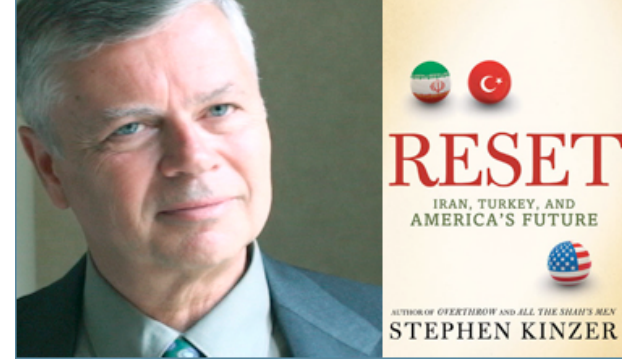

About the Author: Stephen Kinzer is the author of *Overthrow*, *All the Shah's Men*, *Crescent and Star*, and numerous other books. An award-winning foreign correspondent, he served as The New York Times's bureau chief in Turkey, Germany, and Nicaragua and as *The Boston Globe's* Latin America correspondent. He teaches international relations at Boston University and is a frequent contributor to *The New York Review of Books* and a columnist for *The Guardian*. About *RESET: Iran, Turkey, and America's Future*

What can the United States do to help realize its dream of a peaceful, democratic Middle East? Award-winning foreign correspondent Stephen Kinzer offers a surprising answer in his paradigm-shifting book – "*RESET: Iran, Turkey, and America's Future*" (Published by Times Books, released on June 8, 2010). Kinzer argues that two countries in the region are America's logical partners in the twenty-first century: Iran and Turkey.

Kinzer bases this new "power triangle" on the similarities between the countries. They share strategic interests, like a stable Iraq, stable Afghanistan, and stable Pakistan; and their people also share a desire for democratic values. He also recommends that the United States reshape relations with its two traditional Middle East allies, Israel and Saudi Arabia. A master storyteller, Kinzer summons the logic of history to address the future. With an eye for grand characters and illuminating historical detail, Kinzer introduces the reader to larger-than-life figures, like a Nebraska schoolteacher who became a martyr to democracy in Iran, a Turkish radical who transformed his country and Islam forever, and a colorful parade of princes, politicians, women of the world, spies, oppressors, liberators, and dreamers.
